R.I. President-Elect Announces His 2019-2020 Theme

Rotary International President-elect Mark Daniel Maloney explained his vision for building a stronger Rotary, calling on leaders to expand connections to their communities and to embrace innovative membership models.

Maloney, a member of the Rotary Club of Decatur, Alabama, USA, unveiled the 2019-20 presidential theme, *Rotary Connects the World*, to incoming district governors at Rotary's annual training event, the International Assembly, in San Diego, California, USA, on Monday.

"The first emphasis is to grow Rotary — to grow our service; to grow the impact of our projects; but, most importantly, to grow our membership so that we can achieve more," Maloney said. Maloney believes that connection is at the heart of the Rotary experience.

**Clean the World on Soapy Saturday
January 26**

Approximately 6,000 children under the age of five die every day from diseases that result from poor hygiene. Respiratory infections like pneumonia, and diarrheal diseases are prevalent in communities struggling with poverty.

However, many of these deaths could be prevented if families were educated on the dangers posed by germs and had access to clean water, sanitation, and hygiene. In fact, studies show that hand washing with soap and water is the single most effective way to prevent hygiene related deaths, reducing morbidity rates by 50% or more. Therefore, Clean the World Foundation has chosen to focus their efforts on comprehensive Water Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) initiatives that address the complex needs of impoverished communities.

Rotary District 6980 has arranged for two Soapy Saturday hygiene kit building events at Clean the World, 2544 E. Landstreet Rd, Suite 600, Orlando 32824.

The dates are January 26 and March 30 from 9:00 a.m. – noon.

They have reserved 30 spots each day, but that can increase if more members, their families and friends are interested in participating. Additional dates might be added based on response.
